FROM THE PRESIDENT:



Dear Members

A heartfelt welcome to the BU3A 2020 year! The 2020 year has started very well with a record number of classes and a record number of members for the start of a year (over **1500** vs 1300 same time last year). We don't exalt in the numbers – we're just very happy to see how many have continued with us or have joined over the holidays.

Our 2020 Opening was held at the Beaumaris Senior Citizens on Friday 31st January – thanks to everyone who came and made it a special event (over 170 attended) on a very hot day! Our Membership and Marketing Subcommittee and other volunteers did a wonderful job in organising and running this event – many thanks to Deb Stephenson. Special thanks to all the volunteers and especially those cooking the sausage sizzle in very trying conditions.

Southern FM 88.3 conducted an 'outside broadcast' (from the billiard room) and Presenter Graeme Johnstone interviewed Deb Stephenson, Sue Steele, David Peake, Cheryl Threadgold, myself, and the Mayor Councillor Clarke Martin. Graeme's program is called Friday Magazine and is on Fridays from 9.00 am to 11.00 am each Friday.

Proceedings started at 11am and I introduced our Mayor Councillor Clarke Martin who 'opened the year' and updated us on goings on impacting us in Bayside – accompanied by the Council Director of Community and Customer Experience, Bryce Craggs, and Councillor Laurie Evans. Our supporters and sponsors James Newbury (State MP for Brighton), Brad Rowswell (State MP for Sandringham), Mandy Englehardt (Belle Properties/Hocking Stuart) and Irene Peoples (Bendigo Bank), showed their support by attending. I spoke about our need for volunteers (more below) and our Vice President Stephen Le Page gave us some insights on our plans and progress – including the annual hours put in by volunteers (including office and tutors) – 26,850 and 'student hours' - 171,250! Our Course Convenor Sue Steele gave us an update on enrolments, courses and classes – a very special thanks to Sue for the massive job in organising the courses, tutors, venues and class lists – almost all new member enrolments over the holidays were made online – which meant no break for Sue! and many thanks to Chris Logan and our office volunteers for processing all the renewals and new members – and of course to our tutors, those who have 'continued', and a warm welcome to new tutors – I'm sure you will get great satisfaction from your efforts.

2020 classes are now well under way and somehow a place and time was found for all classes – but we are now 'up against it' for classroom space.

Some great activities are coming up over the next couple of months so get your name in early if you want to attend one. We are working on some new beginners' language classes, so look out for them soon.



This course aims to provide interactive learning and discussion, encouraging awareness and skills to support the emotional health and well-being of children.









Local Community Radio Station 88.3 Southern FM are having an Open Day on Saturday 29th February from 11.00am to 3.00pm with a sausage sizzle.
