Moving to Music (M2M)

This new course has been operating in the multipurpose room next to the Beaumaris Library since the start of 2017.

M2M is a lot of fun. We move freely, mostly inspired by videos played on the data projector. There are lots of novelty videos, some very funny, but they're mostly popular songs with dancing performers to mimic if we want. Nobody never prescribes what steps to do, or when to take a break. It's very casual and relaxed, but you can also go as fast as you like, so it can be really good exercise.
